On February 22, the Canadian Parliament – in line with US and other NATO countries - adopted a motion stating that China is conducting genocide against Uyghur Muslims in its Xinjiang province. Many more countries – mostly developing and Muslim-majority ones - have not agreed with this accusation. Instead, they supported and praised China for raising Xinjiang from terrorism and poverty.

Facing this wide split over a very serious accusation, Canadians must ask: What is the truth there?

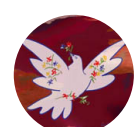

## MODERATOR:



**Pro. Radhika Desai:** Author, editor or co-editor of over 10 books and numerous articles, Radhika is an internationally-renowned scholar on developing countries and geo-political economy. She is a Professor of Political Studies at the University of Manitoba, and is the President of the Society of Socialist Studies.

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## PANELISTS:



**Mme. Lu Xu:** is China's Consul General in Calgary. She has previously served in China's Embassies in England, the Czech and Slovak Republics, and the Consulate General in San Francisco. Prior to her appointment to Canada, she was Deputy Director General of Consular Affairs of China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs.



**Omar Latif:** A long-time activist based in Toronto, he has travelled extensively across the world, including twice to China. Omar visited Xinjiang in the summer of 2019 and is one of the very few western eyewitnesses of what is most recently happening in Xinjiang.



**Daniel Dumbrill:** Having lived in China for 12 years, Daniel is a Canadian with extensive and first-hand knowledge of that country. Among his numerous videos on China, he has made six on Xinjiang - some of them including interviews with Uyghurs opposed to China's government



**Max Blumenthal:** is an award-winning investigative journalist, author, and filmmaker with a deep understanding of American foreign policy and global politics. Max was one of the earliest journalists to identify a problematic narrative on Xinjiang which he exposed in his independent Grayzone reports.
